### **BACKGROUND**

The nation's response to the devastating tsunami that struck South Asia in December of 2004 was astounding. LWR received \$20.4 million in donations to our Wave of Giving™ fund for South Asia. That amount will fully fund our long-term efforts to help communities recover from the disaster, while also addressing the conditions of chronic poverty that made them so vulnerable in the first place.
